Proponent Vision: The Chemical, Biological, Radiological, and Nuclear (CBRN) Regiment assesses, protects, and mitigates the threats, hazards, and consequences of CBRN threats on the battlefield. The destructive potential of CBRN threats that maneuver units confront demands that CBRN Officers possess the ability to analyze difficult situations and advise commanders or leaders much senior to them on complex scenarios. The scope of the threats they combat requires an ability to utilize the latest technologies to counter the threat posed from weapons of mass destruction (WMD) and hazardous materials (HAZMAT) and ensure interoperability with joint forces as well as interagency and international partners. Officers in this branch lead organizations at the Platoon, Company, Battalion, and Brigade level.
