Purpose: BOLC provides you the initial technical and tactical training necessary to successfully perform your duties upon arrival to your first unit. During the course, you will refine the skills learned at your commissioning source in leadership and small unit tactics, while getting your first training on the technical skills related to disbursing, comptroller/budgeting, accounting, payment support, finance systems/platforms, and other technical tasks necessary of Finance and Comptroller Officers.








Where can I go....

How do you assess Cadets?




- 1. Cadet Preference
- 2. FC SCR/ FC Percentiles
- 3. HireVue Interviews
- 4. GPA
- 5. Academic Discipline (Major)
- <u>Preference</u>: Cadet's preference for the particular branch. Preference indicators will be either "Top5" or ordinal ranking of the branch from 6-18. **MOST** considered criteria during rating.
- <u>FC SCR</u>: Cadet's fit score on a scale 1-10. This score is normalized across the entire distribution of cadets and is a function of each branch's unique set of weighted talent priorities from the storyboard.
- <u>FC Percentiles</u>: Cadet's percentile within the cohort based on the branch score (on a scale of 1-100%). Read similar to SAT or GRE results.
- <u>HireVue</u>: Indicates whether or not the cadet completed a HireVue interview with "Y" or "N". **HIGHLY** considered criteria during rating.
- <u>Major</u>: Academic disciplines such as Mathematics, Economics, Business, Finance, Commerce, and Data Analytics are more highly favored...however, a cadet's major is **NOT** a disqualifier for consideration.

Branch Detailing Timeline




FAQs about Branch Detail:

- You do not have to branch detail to become an FC officer
- If branch detailed, you attend the branch detail's BOLC (IN, AR, FA, or CM)
- Once you pin CPT, your branch detail expires, and you attend FCCCC as an FC Officer

Benefits of Branch Detail:

- It offers a wider perspective of the Army that gives skills and knowledge to young officers that can be applied during their transition to FC.
- Experience unit-level leadership and better prepare yourself to take command in various FC units
- Historically, within the Finance Corps most Senior FC Officers are branch detail.
