Health Facility Planning Career Field

Qualified health facility planners, with the 9I additional skill identifier (ASI), are assigned to positions that require special qualifications in developing medical, dental, veterinary, and medical research facility planning concepts; understanding the facility life cycle and construction management; and the ability to translate medical requirements to engineering and architectural concepts.

Health Facility Planning Capability

The Army's health facility planning capability is provided by a multidisciplinary team of health facility planners, architects, engineers, nurses, biomedical equipment technicians, and information technology professionals who work closely together to support the planning, programming design, construction, outfitting, and transition of health care facilities. HFPA is the repository for this capability in the Army and provides deployable and reachback Facility Life Cycle Management (FLCM) support to Joint Task Forces Surgeons, Medical Task Forces, Combat Support Hospitals, Medical Brigades, and Medical Commands (Deployment Support).

The Health Facility Planning Agency (HFPA) was established on September 1, 1975 to be responsible to the Army Surgeon General for the centralized management of the Army Health Facility Construction Program. In the 1990s, HFPA became responsible to the Commander, MEDCOM for the centralized management of the Army Health Facility Life Cycle Management Program. Today, HFPA provides health facility expertise, manages programs, and executes projects to enable Army readiness, support Army Medicine's combat casualty care, and promote a system of health for our Warriors and their Families. HFPA is the sole generating platform for health facility planning and management capability supporting the Land Component.
