



Intelligences

INTERPERSONAL

• The ability to understand and work with other people. Requires a capacity to perceive and be responsive to moods, temperaments, intentions and desires of others. Can view the world from the perspective of others, have the ability to "get in the skin" of others. Excellent networkers, negotiators, trainers, teachers.

BODILY-KINESTHETIC

• Intelligence of the physical self. Talent in controlling one's own movements, as well as manipulating objects skillfully (craftsman, marksman, athletes, surgeons, etc.). Hands-on people with good tactile sensitivity, need to move frequently, often get "gut reactions" to things.

SPATIAL

• Abilities to perceive, transform, and recreate differing aspects of the visual-spatial world. Acute sensitivity to visual details, capable of rapid visualization, ability to draw, sketch, and orient to three dimensions with ease.



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
