Army Logistics is the processes, resources, and systems involved in generating, transporting, sustaining, and redeploying or reallocating materiel and personnel. There are 3 basic branches of Logistics –Transportation, Quartermaster, and Ordnance. Logistics personnel make up approximately 24% of the Total Army Force (Active Duty, National Guard, and Reserves)

With a focus on readiness, sustainment, and operational synchronization, they drive effectiveness and provide commanders with endurance and operational reach to achieve mission success.

#### **INTELLIGENCES:** Bodily-Kinesthetic, Interpersonal, Spatial

SKILLS: As the US Army's distinguished tactical and technical explosives threat mitigation specialists, Explosive Ordnance Disposal (EOD) Officers need to operate confidently with detailed and disciplined accuracy under stressful conditions, be mentally tough, work calmly under pressure, maintain flexibility in dynamic operating environments, and be prudent risk takers. They must be effective communicators with an extreme aptitude for planning and organizing EOD operations in support of military units worldwide (to include foreign allies/partner forces), US law enforcement officials/civil authorities, VIP support to the US Secret Service, and across all multi-domain operational environments.

KNOWLEDGE: The Explosive Ordnance Disposal career field values Officers with academic backgrounds from a wide variety of disciplines and majors. However, the domain-specific disciplines listed below provide Officers with expertise closely aligned with executing dynamic EOD mission requirements and operations.






